

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

I was a freshman in college when the Off Broadway hit musical, *Little Shop of Horrors*, seemed to spread out across the world all at once. In 1986 the movie version was released, I went to see a Sacramento Theatre Company production, and my college was also producing it in 1987. From 1986 on there was a "Little Shop" mania for a few years. Why not? The show was perfect—a small, easy to produce crowd pleaser with a terrific score and a movie version to help make the title well known to everyone. The biggest challenge was building the "Audrey II" plant puppets, but once built, theatre groups were renting them out to other groups in need.

"Little Shop" predates the Disney animation renaissance of the 1990s, which was headed by its authors, Alan Menken and Howard Ashman. If you think Audrey's plaintive "Somewhere that's Green," sounds strangely like the Little Mermaid's "Part of Your World," you aren't wrong—they come from the same minds.

The original New York Off Broadway production ran for five years between 1982 and 1987, with Muppet alum, Frank Oz, helming the film version in 1986. The show also ran in London in 1983 for 813 performances, followed by major productions in Australia and Canada.

The idea for the show came from an unlikely source: a low budget horror/comedy movie of the same name directed by Roger Corman in 1962. It also featured a young Jack Nicholson. In 2004, this little cult movie turned Off (Continued...)

Broadway hit, finally made it to Broadway for 372 performances—a strangely short run for such a beloved show. In 2019, "Little Shop" was revived Off Broadway again and is still going strong.

Essential to any production of "Little Shop" is the man eating plant character named "Audrey II." Martin P. Robinson set the original template for the puppets to represent the four stages of Audrey II's growth during the story. The puppets in our production come from Broadway Sacramento, having engaged the puppet master, Richard Bay, to create them for a 2018 Music Circus production.

There is always a production of "Little Shop" going on somewhere in the world. Even my high school alma mater is producing it this coming spring. The show has entered the status of "classic," and is part of that rare group of thirty or so musicals that have been in continual production since they first premiered.


